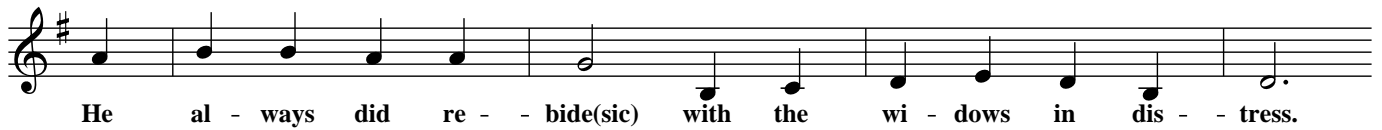
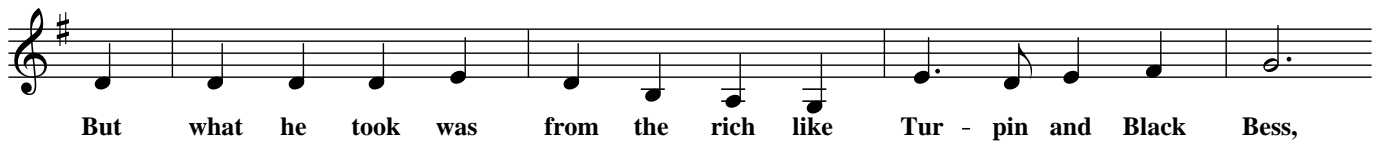
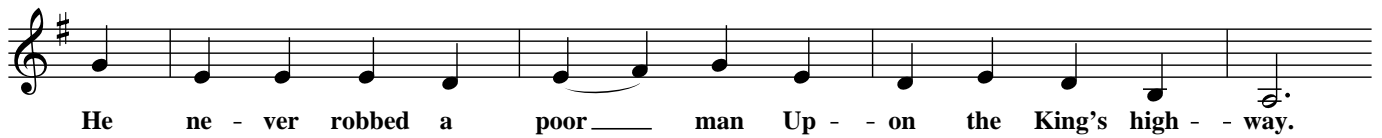
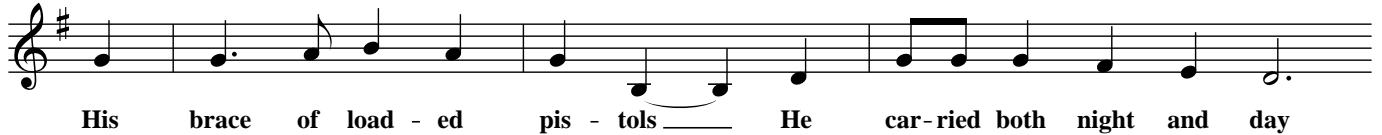
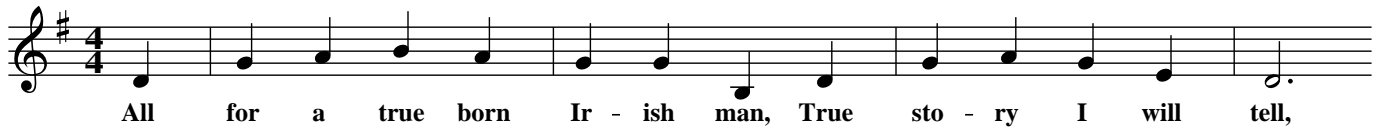


## Brandon on the Moor
